“We believe that being a good steward to the land is not only a responsibility, but an essential step in making truly great wines. Our grapes are hand-harvested. We crush our fruit by foot to handle it in the least aggressive way possible. Our goal with each lot is to ferment with the natural yeasts abundant in our vineyards, and to let malolactic fermentation also take its natural course. No commercial acids are added to our wines. Use of new oak barrels and sulfur is also minimized.”

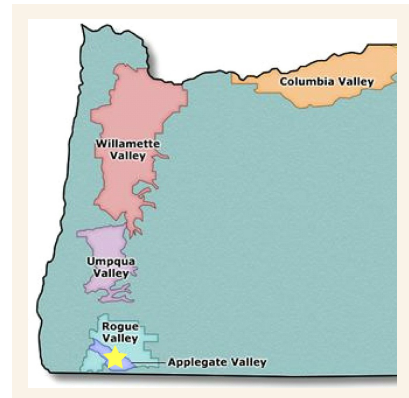


Meet Our Winemakers **Steve Hall**

Regional Info

Applegate Valley is located in moderate-climate Southern Oregon, fifty miles north of the California border. While the first grape plantings can be traced back to 1852, the region was awarded AVA status in 2001. Applegate Valley receives under 25 inches of rainfall each year, and the grapes benefit from warm, long days turning into cooler nights. The alluvial, well-draining soils are highly composed of granite, and vineyards can be found up to 2,000ft in elevation.



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
